In New Jersey, Discharge Prevention, Containment, and Countermeasure (DPCC) Plans must be renewed every three years. For facilities with an approved or conditionally approved DPCC plan, the renewal must be submitted 180 days before the expiration date of the existing plan. This renewal process requires either revised plans reflecting any updates or a certification that the existing plans are current and compliant. Failure to submit a renewal on time could result in the plan being considered expired.
